## *Spring Program Highlights*

On May 1<sup>st</sup> nearly 60 community gardeners attended the **Beyond the Rectangle: Creating Unique & Efficient Planting Spaces** workshop at the Garden of Love on 116<sup>th</sup> Street. Eric Thomann (pictured) of Twigcraft and the Backyard Garden and Gary Baum of City Beautiful Carpentry explained how to build a tiered planting bed, a six-sided bed, a raised bed

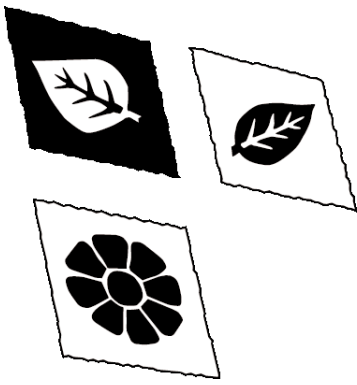
with an attached trellis and a standard raised bed. Afterwards, registered GreenThumb gardens were eligible to order untreated lumber for building raised beds in their own gardens. Remember - if you missed ordering soil and compost from GreenThumb to fill up your beds - it is not too late to pick up free compost -- check out [www.nyccompost.org](http://www.nyccompost.org) for details.

### By Train

F TRAIN: to 21<sup>st</sup> St./Queensbridge - walk south on 21<sup>st</sup> St. towards Queens Plaza South. Make right onto QPS, walk 4 blocks to 10<sup>th</sup> St, Compound on your right.

N, W, 7 TRAINS: to Queensboro Plaza/Bridge Plaza-walk along Queens Plaza South, towards the East River, to 10<sup>th</sup> St. Compound is on your right.

### By Car

FROM MANHATTAN & THE BRONX: Take FDR to 61<sup>st</sup> St exit. Follow signs to Queensboro Bridge. Staying in the right-hand lane of the bridge, exit to local streets. Continue straight to end, Northern Blvd/Jackson Avenue intersection. Make a right onto Jackson Ave (Northern Blvd). Make a right onto 21<sup>st</sup> St. and then a left onto Queens Plaza South. Continue on QPS til 10<sup>th</sup> St. Compound is on your right, across from 10<sup>th</sup> St.

FROM BROOKLYN, QUEENS & STATEN ISLAND: From Brooklyn, Queens & Staten Island: Take the BQE to McGuiness Blvd exit. Make a left onto McGuiness Blvd. Continue straight into Queens (over the Pulaski Skyway Bridge). McGuiness Blvd becomes 11<sup>th</sup> St. Stay straight on 11<sup>th</sup> St, make left onto Queens Plaza South. Go 1 block to 10<sup>th</sup> St. Compound is on your right.
